I've been a member since 2020 and have mostly played Golf Croquet, though I've dabbled in Six Wicket and plan to explore Association Croquet this fall. Over the past few years, I've had the pleasure of serving the Club in various ways: as Chair of the Nominating Committee (where we introduced electronic voting), on the Transparency and By-Laws Task Forces, and volunteering at the Saturday Visitors' clinics and NCC events.

As many of you may know, recent changes have taken place on the Club Board. **Tom Lindley**, President, and **Bob Broadway**, Treasurer, have both stepped down. Please join me in thanking them for their years of dedication and the many contributions they made to the Club. Following these resignations, the Board convened and voted to appoint me as President and **Trudy Crowetz** as our new Treasurer. Initially, the Board considered also filling the Vice President seat but decided to leave that position vacant until our December elections—giving you, the members, the opportunity to vote on who should take on that leadership role. Trudy brings a wealth of financial and organizational experience, and we're lucky to have her stepping into this vital position. Please help me welcome her to the Board and thank her for taking on this important responsibility.

It's been a busy and exciting summer! You've probably noticed the refreshed Club website. We're integrating new software to streamline many of the things you do as a member: soon you'll be able to renew your membership online, RSVP for events, and even pay fees directly through the website. This will make participating in Club activities more convenient than ever.

We're also launching new initiatives to connect with our members more meaningfully. We want to hear from you, your feedback, your ideas, your experience. Part of this effort stems from the work of the Membership Committee, whose marketing plan is helping us shape a stronger and more inclusive Club. I truly want to ensure that every member feels welcomed, engaged, and valued. If you ever have thoughts to share, concerns, suggestions, or simply something you love about the Club, I'm always reachable by phone, text, or email. You're never a bother.

Looking ahead, some exciting developments are on the horizon at the NCC. Construction has begun on the new Pro/Practice Court near the pond, and the CFA is moving forward with permitting for the Palm Courts, with groundbreaking expected this fall.

One of my personal goals as President is to work closely with the CFA and our Club committees to grow and diversify our membership. As the Center expands, so should our community. Fundraising efforts are underway to help bring lighting to more courts, something I believe is key to improving accessibility, growing the sport, and strengthening our Club. This investment will help us maintain affordable dues, reach new players, and ensure a vibrant future for everyone who enjoys the game.

The NCC is Expanding and Upgrading, Slow But Steady

One new Court. The first of our six new courts is nearing completion by the pond! The grass takes six to eight weeks to grow in, so it should be playable by October. The surrounding area is also being completely redesigned and replanted. The court will be somewhat smaller than a regulation court, so we're making that the Pro Court. It will also be available as a practice court when not required by the Pro. This frees up court 12 for normal booking.

Parking Lot and Five Courts. We just got comments from Palm Beach County this week about the remaining courts and parking lot construction. We hope to resolve those issues and contract for the remaining five courts soon. Unfortunately, work on the parking lot must be delayed until next summer. That will provide 25 new parking spaces and excavate the exfiltration trenches under the parking lot needed to provide the water retention capacity lost by building the new courts.

Pavilions. In the good news department, you'll be happy to hear that we've just contracted to repair and refurbish all of the existing pavilions, including installation of new striped covers. We're also launching a new campaign to find a single donor to fund and name a beautiful new Entertainment Pavilion with handicap-accessible restrooms, entertainment space, and much more. It will be located about where the NCC sign and flags are now.

Court Lighting. We continue to fundraise (please help!) and talk to contractors about new courtlighting layouts and designs. We hope to have at least courts six and seven lit up by fall. Once the courts, lighting, pavilions and other exterior plans are complete, we will turn our focus back to the building itself - bathrooms, locker rooms, ballroom, and a beautiful second floor veranda, kitchen, bar, and offices, as soon as finances allow.

We hope you had a great summer and look forward with excitement to the upcoming season. The highlight will be hosting the World Championship for Association Croquet ("The Worlds") starting mid-October with players and visitors from around the world!

We are hoping that some of these great European players will join us at NCC for the October AC Worlds and the January Women's Tournament!



Good news! We've stocked up on First-Aid kits. While it seems that croquet is the only injury-free sport, we do manage a few emergencies. We encourage bold strategy on the court, but we'd rather your scrapes be treated quickly, and your aches and pains come from the game.

Thank you **Jay Carey** for donating these First-Aid kits. They are tucked inside the cabinets by courts 3–4, 5–6, and 9–10. If you happen to hit the wicket with your leg instead of the ball, and land a little too enthusiastically, you will find First-Aid nearby.

The main First-Aid cabinet is still located in the front office, and the AED (defibrillator) will soon relocate near the locker rooms for quicker access in case of emergency.

Stay safe, play smart, and remember: the only thing we want bruised out there is your ego (just a little) after a good match!
